Tonight, as we reflect on the stories of the valley of the dry bones and of Jesus and Lazarus, we are reminded of Jesus' eternal healing.


During worship, you are invited to light a candle (or candles) for loved ones and for those whom you pray.

Into each conflict, division, and war, Come, Christ Jesus, be our peace. Into this wounded world, Come, Christ Jesus, be our hope. When we call to you, hear our cry. Do not abandon us, but draw near. Come, Christ Jesus, be our life.





Now in peace I will lie down and sleep;


you alone, O God, make me secure.
