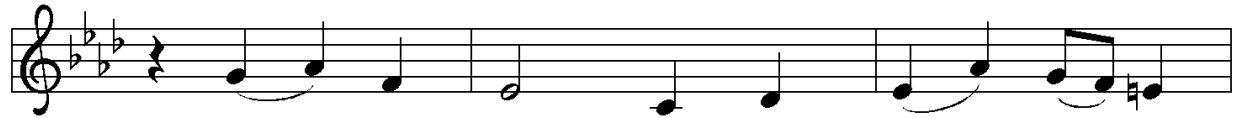

FIRST READING: Jeremiah 31:1-6

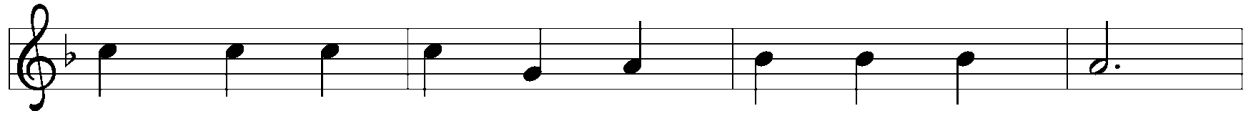

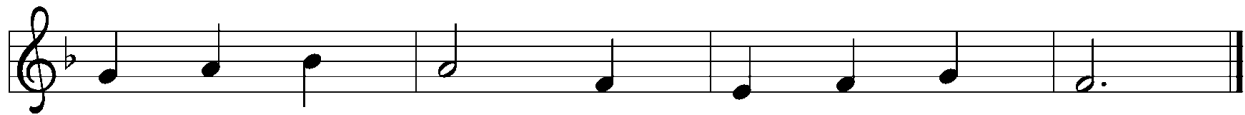

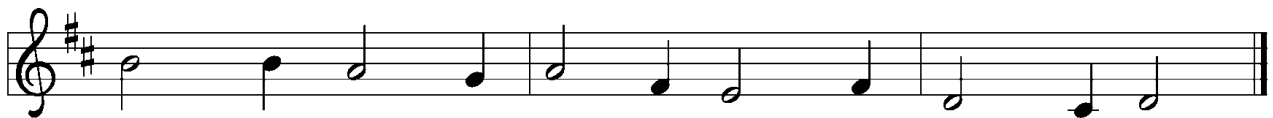
